



on my entry I am puzzled by your reference to people
in glass houses shouldn't throw stones, could you explain.

After a long interim that has elapsed since
I last wrote about the focussed View of T.V.S.
(Technology, Values, and society) perspective. Aside from the
nuts and bolts problems of building the thing and making
it work (which is possible if we want to do it) and the problems
of getting a closed system ecology to survive (something which
we haven't yet found con or can't be done, ~~research~~ research is still
to be done to answer that question) An important question
is the individual psychological impact of the environment.

The first thing considered was the enclosed nature of the colony.

This is one of the first situations where a voluntary
group of people are restricted to a limited area with
a reasonably large amount of work necessary to move beyond
those limits. Parallel do exist as a matter of fact

a large fraction of the people who have ever lived were born,
lived, and died within a relatively small area. Another parallel
is the colonists of the U.S. in the ~~mid~~ mid 1600s. Every

prison has people restricted to a much smaller volume
than that of a habitat of the size one'll talk about.

Also along with this are problems caused by claustrophobic reactions
and crowding. ~~the~~ I don't believe that the T.V.S.

group gave enough credit to the resistance of the human
psyche. Claustrophobic reactions were controlled
in the case of subnormals and those unsuitable were
weeded out. Also may I point out that there won't
be sex-separation and that population density should
be about that of Rome thus I don't think the
problems of enclosure are that impossible, as to
the problems of living in a "technological caisson"
(as Don Ihde puts it) What do you think ~~an~~ ~~that~~ is?

the only other problem I can see coming up is the differences in the day today experience that happen differently on a habitat than on a planet. We didn't see many of these perhaps because we didn't look close enough in the right places from the right perspective. However barring some unforeseen mind-blowing difference, the psychological problems will be there. Over time it's inevitable. To end up some psychological effects may even be positive, climate has a great effect on mood. I might never have to go through depression when winter is just starting to come on.

I just had a productive discussion
with JOE (B.). We've solved the energy
crisis. A lot of people have given a lot of thought
to "beaming down" microwave energy from satellites that collect
solar energy. Any engineer (even me) should see the weakness
of this proposal. The atmospheric attenuation of any electromagnetic
energy is on the order of 10^{-15} . This means that if you

I think the psychology is less trouble than the ecology of a space colony. (Typical reaction from an ecologist) Larry Slobodkin, right on this campus, is one of the greatest ecologists of our time. He has done some work on this problem, to wit, the necessity for some critical size before an ecosystem works. Consider*


1) Take a pond. In the water of the pond is a great assemblage of plankton. Put a glass barrier across the pond

And wait awhile



Chances are the phytoplankton won't change much, if at all. Keep cutting the pond in half though until you get this

And wait a while
(several days)



and you will find that as the area gets smaller, the diversity of the plankton will decrease ~~until~~ until in the smallest areas maybe only one or two species are still alive. So this ecosystem apparently has a great dependence on size even though the ~~smallest~~ ^{smallest} division of the pond is many times larger than the plankton being considered

In the same vein; if you go into a forest and drive a barrier into the ground to a depth of six inches or so, and thusly enclose the soil

* This is somewhat paraphrased from one of his lectures.

microfauna (mites and such), the size of the enclosure has much to do with the resulting change. Drive a fence around a 100 foot square, and nothing will happen. But a 3 foot square will become void of life in days.

(Me again) → ~~closed systems~~ "closed ecologies" may be possible, but they are not easy to set up. ~~Ecosystems~~ tend to lose stability and resilience as they decrease in size. A closed system inside a 10 mile diameter colony might be a trick several orders of magnitude harder than simply building a structure up there.

Larry - you're full of shit if you think the atmosphere attenuates 10^{-15} ~~11~~. It's more like 10^{-2} and that's an average figure for visible light. You can select a microwave frequency that will slip in with less than 10^{-1} loss. Just pick a nice spot off a high absorption peak.

An interesting idea - what if atmosphere did attenuate 10^{-15} ? Since solar flux on a good day is about $1\text{cal/cm}^2\text{ sec}$ at the surface that would mean that it is $10^{15}\text{ cal/cm}^2\text{ sec}$ above the atmosphere. This means a satellite up there would be exposed to about as much energy as if it were at ground zero of a hydrogen explosion (fusion, dummies $\text{H}_2 + \text{O}_2 \rightarrow 2\text{H}_2\text{O}$). ~~that~~ Must ask Neil Armstrong how he trained to survive the warm weather.

On a less sarcastic note
